<u>BEST PRACTICE-1:</u> DESIGNING OF PSYCHOLOGY WEBSITE FOR SRI VISHNU EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY:

THE CONTEXT THAT REQUIRED THE INITIATION OF THE PRACTICE:

Personal, academic, social, and professional success depend on the student's ability to manage these aspects of their lives. These conditions may hinder students from excelling on tests, completing assignments or even making it to class. In extreme cases, students may even drop out of college. Young people are spending most of their day on the internet – experiencing cyber-crimes, cyber bullying, and playing violent video games. suicide and substance of abuse numbers have been steadily rising and young adults are in the age when serious psychological problems can occur and yet they are taught little to nothing about those.

Sri Vishnu Educational Society has diversified student community of various age groups under multidisciplinary programs and courses in technology, sciences, medical, pharmaceutical etc, comprising of 10000 plus students around. Department of Psychology, a wing of Sri Vishnu Educational society wants to bring attention to above cited issues of its students and staff who are facing multiple psychological issues and begin the conversation around what they need in order to grow up healthy, happy and resilient.

Since students and sometimes faculty may hesitate to come forward and open about their challenges and issues related to psychological wellbeing there must be a common plat form like a website to resolve.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1) To conduct psychology screening tests to know the behaviour/ personality of the student community.
- Students will understand their psychological issues individually and get help out of frequently answered questions.

- To empower pupil to reclaim their lives by providing guidance, counselling, psychotherapy and life skills for improving psychological wellbeing. And activities to improve their personality

BEST PRACTICE-2:

<u>TITLE OF THE BEST PRACTICE</u>: Best practices visit to Reputed Colleges in various States THE CONTEXT THAT REQUIRED THE INITIATION OF THE PRACTICE:

Best practices make colleges more efficient in delivering knowledge to the students and also create the learning culture in student community over a period of time. The same is discussed many times in IQAC meetings and other informal meetings in college. The initiation to achieve this by visiting colleges with reputation and long history in degree education came from our Honourable Vice Chairman and Management team along with CAC. Heads of the departments and senior faculty are chosen by principal sir to visit and learn details about Best practices in Hyderabad (Telangana), Bangalore (Karnataka) and Chennai (Tamilnadu) States. Different syllabi and course structures and recent trends in knowledge, programs across southern states also one of the reasons behind the Best practices visit.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1) To Visit the reputed degree colleges in Telangana, Karnataka and Tamilnadu states to learn the best practices implemented in those colleges.
- 2) To implement the suitable best practices in our college in tune with our environment and sustainability of academics as early as possible.
- To create the learning culture on par with best colleges in cities like Chennai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru.
- 4) Students' involvement in various activities, student culture, achievements/success stories to get motivation and initiation for their implementation for future academics.
- 5) To get research provisions, collaborative activities, MOU acquisitions on proper grounds (if applicable)
- 6) To know better Functioning of IQAC, placements training and career guidance activities,

PROCEDURE/PRACTICE OF THE OBJECTIVE:

After Vice chairman Sir initiation, Principal Sir immediately submitted a plan to the higherups and sought permission. He selected HODs and senior faculty and made them into three groups. The cities for visits chosen are Hyderabad, Bangalore and Chennai. It is decided that one group will visit one city reputed colleges/universities/institutions in that area and finally all the best practices will be discussed in detail after the completion of visits. They need to submit a report to the principal, after final consolidation suitable plan of action will be given by the Principal to IQAC and CAC. All the members tried for permissions from reputed degree colleges in Hyderabad, Chennai and Bangalore and they are acquired with the help of campus industry liaison officers. As our college is running B.Sc, B.Com, M.Sc, MCA courses the visits are also planned for colleges with similar courses. The colleges are chosen in such a way that all are autonomous with NAAC accredited "A" or higher status and having research, career guidance culture.

- 1) Total 3 teams are framed for this purpose; in which One team visited Loyola College, Maris Stella College in Chennai, One team went for St. Joseph College, Mount Carmel College for women, Christ University, and Kristu Jayanti College in Bengaluru; One team visited St. Ann's College and Aurora College in Hyderabad. Each team spent minimum of three working days (excluding travel time) and observed all the best practices in those colleges. All the principals and IQAC in charges from cited colleges received our teams generously; and their hospitality is really appreciable. Our teams keenly observed the best practices in those colleges, visited labs and interacted with faculty, HOD's, librarians and other key persons. Employees of our society in Hyderabad, Chennai and Bangalore and industry liaison officers team helped our teams in these visits.
- 2) After completion of these visits all the three groups sat together and listed out best practices observed along with material collected from those colleges and a report was submitted to principal sir. Based on the report a final report was made by principal sir and submitted to Vice chairman sir.

PROBLEMS/CHALLENGES ENCOUNTERED & RESOURCES REQUIRED:

There are no major problems. Only minor problems encountered.

- 1) Getting permission from few colleges due to their academic, placement activities schedules.
- 2) Travelling long distances in short duration. Resources are provided by Management and our society institutions in Hyderabad, Chennai and Bangalore.
- 3) Framing/designing suitable plan of action after these visits for the implementation of gathered information for future course. Suitable Metrics formation for the practices which are going to be implemented.
- 4) Since the institutions visited are diversified under various criterion, it is not practically possible for the visited teams to design common issues/ questionnaire /specific process for information gathering, to accomplish the tasks attained. So each team went with their own plan of action and questionnaire preparation and submitted their report in desired format to the Principal.

EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

- The satisfaction in visited Teams and management appreciation on Final report itself is a major success of "Best practices visit". The implementation of club activities is also an immediate success. We hope that the real success will be visible in few years.
